Cabinet Organization

The new establishment of Hong Kong and Kowloon Zones since the beginning of the term proves so far fairly successful, much to the credit of the two zone chairmen, Lion Andrew Wong of the Hong Kong Zone and Lion Julio Templo of the Kowloon Zone. The 10 Clubs are equally divided in these two zones, and the two zone chairmen with their frequent visitations of Clubs in their respective Zones have relieved certain responsibilities of the District Governor.

The Drama Committee was established in August 1969 with Lion Andrew Wong as the chairman and Lion Thomas Wei the deputy chairman. The function of this committee is to discover talents among the Lions and to get them together in drama activities. Members of this Committee staged two shows in the year, one a "Can-can" dance at the 8th Orient & Southeast Asian Lions Convention at Taipei in November 1969, and one Chinese show at the Joint Charity Ball in April, 1970. Both shows swept great applause and members taking part did enjoy the fellowship and fun together.

Honorary Committee

This Committee, chaired by Past District Governor Francis Pan, invited all past district governors as its members. Valuable advices have been given to the District Governor from time to time, although no official meeting was held. Members of this Committee did meet once in February, 1970 at an informal lunch, during which meeting it was proposed to form a permanent Council of Past District Governors as a consultative body to the District Governor.

International Relations Committee

Past District Governor Paul Lau ably chaired this Committee. This job has not been easy. During the year, many sisterhood alliances were matched between Clubs in this District and those of other Districts, including Thailand, Japan, Australia, Canada, Korea, South Vietnam & etc. Sisterhood Alliance was also sought by Clubs in Districts 302-E3 and 20-S. In all, over 80% of our Clubs are holding from one to four sisterhood alliance with Clubs of other Districts.

Publication Committee

The official publication of the District, "The Hong Kong Lion," continued to exist in its third year, although its contents and punctuality were subjects of great criticism. Lion P. C. Chau, Chairman of the Committee, together with the Chief Editor, Lion K. H. Hwang, and the Managing Editor, Lion William Mok, put much time and effort throughout the year to keep the magazine going. On the financial side, subscriptions and advertisements managed to offset the expenditure with a little surplus. A study committee was formed in February 1970 under the chairmanship of the current Deputy District Governor. Lion Simon Lee, to study ways and means of improving the magazine. We are at the moment still waiting for the result. I am proud to say that our magazine has a world-wide circulation as many District Governors of other Districts are on the mailing list.

Convention Coordinating Committee

It cannot be denied that this committee was one of the busiest committees in the District. It organised the Hong Kong delegations to the 52nd Lions International Convention in Tokyo in July 1969, to the 8th Orient & Southeast Asian Lions Convention in Taipei in November, 1969 and is at present organizing a delegation to the 9th Orient & Southeast Asian Lions Convention in Nagoya in September 1970. Lion Joe Wu, as the chairman, did a very good job in making each of the delegations very successful.

District Reception Committee

Again this Committee was exceptionally busy in the first half of the term. Because of the International Convention in Tokyo in July, 1969, we had few thousand Lions visitors before and after the Convention. Lion Thomas Wei, chairman of the Committee, did a wonderful job in receiving these visitors and in arranging for them to meet the local Lions and to participate in our local functions and activities. Reception desk was set up at the air terminal and Hong Kong Lions Trade Directories were distributed.

Membership Development Committee

At the end of March, 1970, we had 534 Lions including 49 chartered members of the 10th Club, the Lions Club of Kwun Tong. Three Clubs showed a net loss in membership from 5 to 11, and only one club a net gain of 9 members. However, a significance of consolidation appeared in many Clubs and that drastic action was taken in dropping undesired members. The result was, therefore, that whilst during the period 113 new members were inducted, 69 old members were either dropped or resigned themselves. The Committee had successfully staged three attendance contests in the three joint meetings. The 4th and grand final contest will take place at the next joint meeting. Notwithstanding the heavy pressure of his personal business, Lion Samuel Gee Yen carried out his duty as chairman of the Committee very truthfully.

Extension Committee

Our 10th Club, the Lions Club of Kwun Tong, was inaugurated in October, 1969 with 49 chartered members, sponsored by the Lions Club of Hong Kong (Host), after almost two years in organising. Three new Clubs have been proposed and may be materialised in next year. The chairman of the Committee, Lion Seto Yu, put a great effort in pushing the Extension work.

Project Liaison Committee

Looking for projects at the District level has never been an easy job. This year, our policy was to diversify our means to small projects for the Youth, especially youth of the remote villages in the New Territories. Chairman Lion Buddy Butt spent considerable time and effort in this respect, but so far due to various reasons, we have not been able to accomplish much. Besides helping the Youth Centre in Ma On Shan operated by the Catholic and the Holy Carpenter Youth Centre in Valley Road, a Scholarship Foundation Fund was set up in the Hong Kong Technical College. We also continued to sponsor, in joint venture with CARE, the gardening Contest operated by the Education Department, and the Agriculture and Fishery Department for primary school for the third time. Proposals for reading rooms for the Youth in the New Territories have been received and are being considered and studied by the Committee. Some proposals of minor projects were recommended to individual Clubs.

Public Relations Committee

Lion Cecil Chao, the Chairman, kept a very good relationship with the press, broadcasting and television bodies. Activities and functions of the District were widely reported.

Youth Exchange Committee

This Committee, under the able chairmanship of Lion William Wong, received and accommodated two Youths from Australia. At the end of this month there will be two young girls sponsored by District 304 S-1 of Salem, India. They will be accommodated in Lions' families.

The Committee is planning to stage an essay competition opened to local boys and girls between the ages of 15 to 21. The winner will be awarded a free trip to Australia. Quantas Airlines has kindly donated the return passage. Let's wish the project a success, as this youth will be the very first one that our District ever send out to visit other country.

Lions Leadership Forum

I regret much to report that Lion A.M. Prata resigned from Chairmanship at the end of 1969 and fortunately a very senior Lion D.Y. Lee, undertook to fill up the post. The forum is scheduled to take place on the 6th June, 1970.

Lions Joint Charity Ball 1970

The Lions Joint Charity Ball 1970 was held in the 3rd April, 1970 at the Hong Kong Hilton under the able chairmanship of Lion Thomas Wei. The result was very consolatory as after several months of hard work by all the Lions, some \$300,000.00 were raised. Good fellowship was seen in this function.

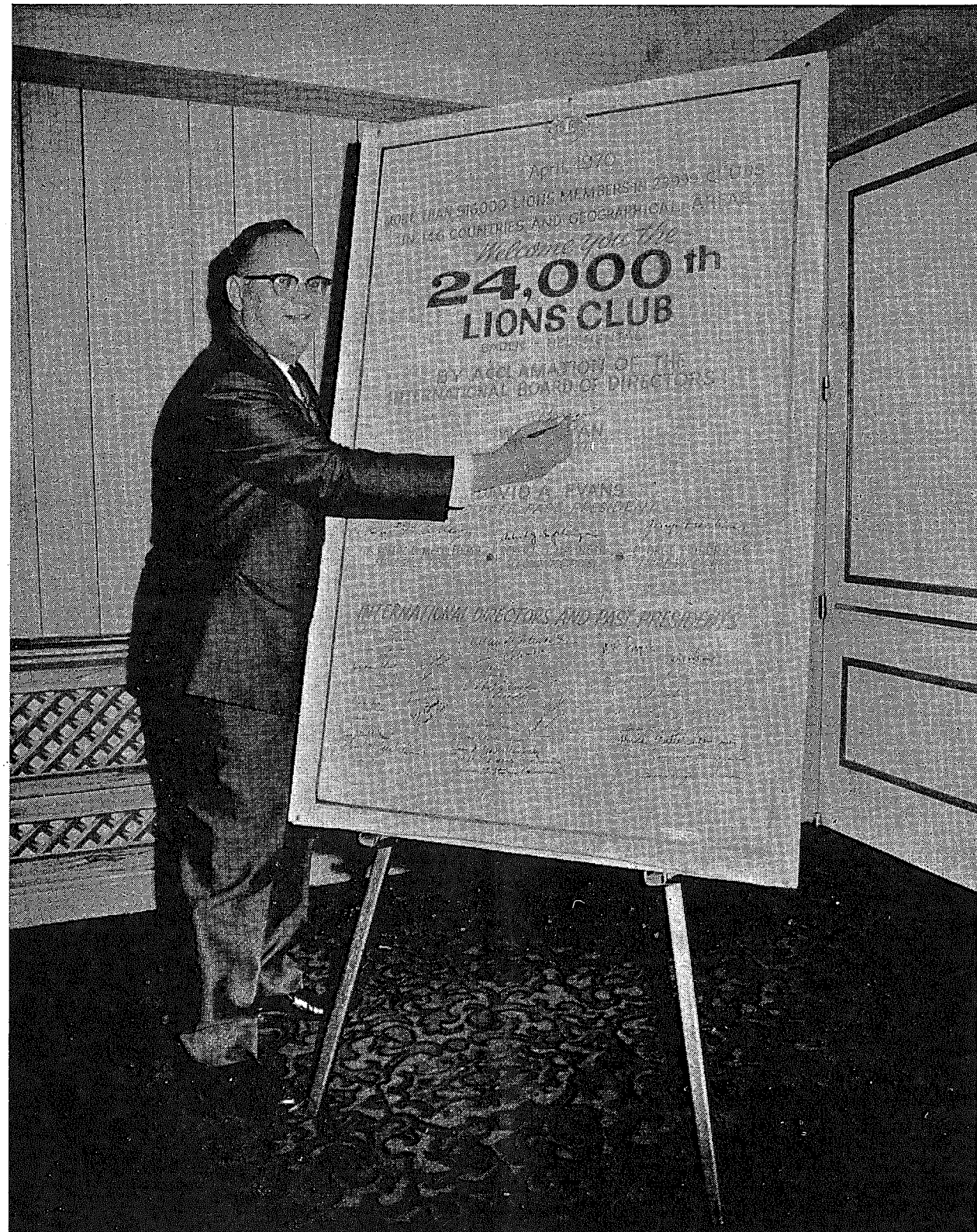

District Projects

Report for Period July 1969-April 1970

(BUDDY BUTT—District Project Chairman)

In the period under review, three meetings of the Club Project Chairmen were held—on August 19, October 16, 1969 and March 17, 1970. Minutes of these meetings were supplied to all Club chairmen, the District Governor and the Cabinet Secretary. A summary of the projects completed and the assistance rendered are listed below.

303 Scholarships for the Hongkong Technical College (administered by the Education Department)	\$ 30,000.00

** This is part of the \$50,000.00 approved for similar projects in the New Territories. Other projects now being studied are (A) Sha Tau Kok Rural Committee, a youth centre which may cost about \$25,000.00 to erect and (B) a similar center in Nam Chung village in the Sha Tau Kok area costing slightly less. Further details will be submitted by the Taipo District Office.

WONG WAN ISLAND HOUSING UNITS. This joint venture with CARE for which the District had pledged \$70,000.00 (upgraded from \$40,000.00) to meet the revised estimate of \$200,000.00 has to be abandoned because of an unexpected turn of events. The fishing community there for whose benefit and well being this project was planned wrote to CARE through the New Territories District Office, remorsefully withdrawing themselves from this scheme. Naturally this came as a complete surprise to all concerned. Although this was not stated in their letter, CARE opined that the reason was "political" in nature. Because of recent occurrences in the border areas the fishermen are nervous of "kidnapping" by elements across the border and some of the fisherfolks are contemplating moving out of their homes to more "secure" areas. Naturally all of us, particularly CARE, are much upset by this turn of events as much time and effort had been expended on this project. This amount of money will have to be re-allocated for other worthwhile use.

MORNING HILL SCHOOL FOR MENTALLY HANDICAPPED CHILDREN

The above project for which the District pledged \$200,000.00 nearly two years ago can still be classified as being in the "Blue Print Stage". Mr. Rainbird, Chairman of the Association for Mentally Handicapped Children and Young Persons, in his latest "progress" report dated March 26, 1970, stated that the Colonial Secretariat will be drawing up the lease conditions on the land made available for the School as soon as the papers are submitted to them by the Crown Lands and Survey Department. The Education Department also plays a part in this scheme, so we have the usual picture of a cumbersome government machinery to contend with. If this is oiled properly, we may, hopefully, get this project off the ground in the latter part of summer 1970.

Needless to say the District has received many requests for assistance ranging from a few hundred dollars to several hundred thousand dollars which had to be denied because they did not meet our yardstick of priority, purposefulness and urgency.

In conclusion, I wish to reiterate my previous observation regarding poor attendance at meetings of project chairmen suggestive of general apathy in this very important phase of Lionistic work.

Courtesy Campaign

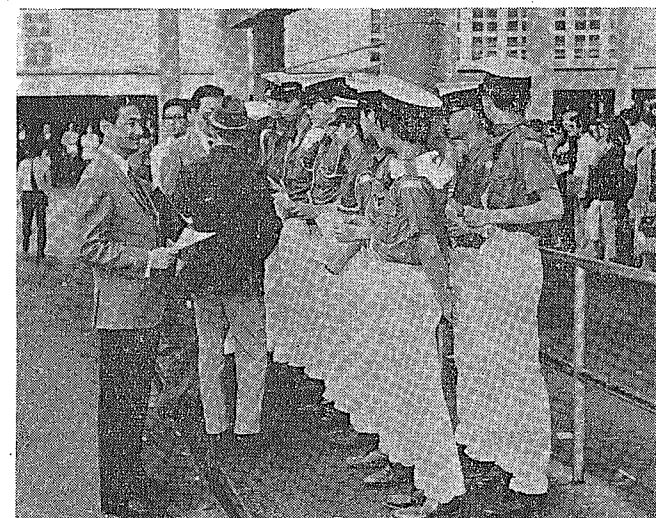

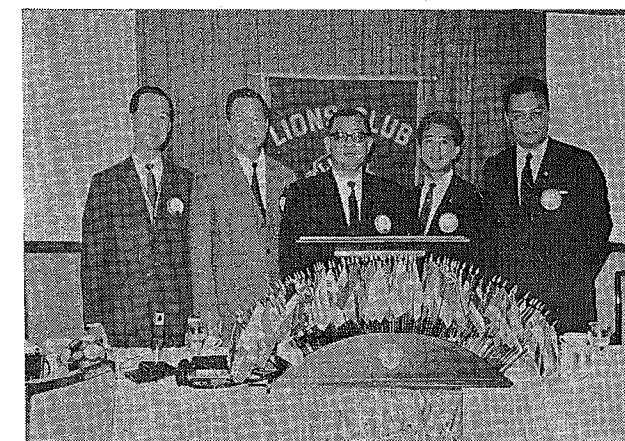

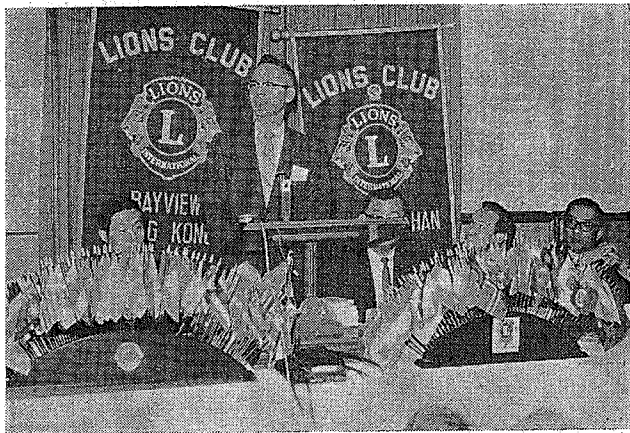
